Our Purpose

The purpose of the Lost Pines Groundwater Conservation District, as per Texas Water Code 36, Section 36.0015 is to provide for the preservation, protection, recharging, and prevention of waste of groundwater and of groundwater reservoirs or their subdivisions and to control subsidence caused by the withdrawal of water from those reservoirs. It has an obligation under Texas Water Code section 36.1071 to develop a groundwater management plan providing management goals to help the district meet that purpose. Under Texas Water Code section 36.101, the district also has rulemaking authority to adopt and enforce rules to carry out its purpose. Private well owners are independently responsible for monitoring the quality of their wells.
